Activity Description:

The 30th Annual Advances in Urology meeting is designed for practicing urologists who are interested in updating their knowledge in the diagnosis, evaluation and management of urologic problems. A distinguished faculty will present advances in the management of urological problems including uro-oncology, sexual function, female pelvic medicine, robotic and minimally invasive surgery, prostate and bladder cancer and reconstructive surgery with a strong emphasis on the technical aspects of various urological procedures. Topics will also cover updates on billing and coding and point of care ultrasound.

Target Audience:

The course is specifically designed to meet the educational needs of Urologists, Advance Practice Practitioners and Allied Healthcare Professionals.

- Recognize advances in endoscopic kidney stone treatment.
- Identify third line options for over active bladder and treatment of voiding dysfunction in women.
- Recognize changes in office billing.
- Describe technology and coding for in office radiology.
