- **Differentiate** between skin biopsy techniques and know when, why and how to perform them.
- **Correctly document** E/M services and accurately code for dermatological procedures.
- **Appropriately utilize** an understanding of the use of Botulinum Toxins, Fillers, lasers and IPL use in dermatology cosmetic procedures.
- **Recognize** aging skin changes and implement cosmetic interventions.
- **Review** basic dermatologic surgery techniques and suture materials.
